Differentiation:

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Circle the exclamations that could be used as a warning. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 2 and 3 phonetic decoding is required.

Expected Circle the exclamations that could be used as a warning. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 4 and 5 phonetic decoding is required.

Greater Depth Circle the exclamations that could be used as a warning. Includes one-word exclamations where split digraphs and polysyllabic words, that are difficult to decode, are used.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Add an ! to words that can be an exclamation. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 2 and 3 phonetic decoding is required.

Expected Add an ! to words that can be an exclamation. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 4 and 5 phonetic decoding is required.

Greater Depth Add an ! to words that can be an exclamation. Includes one-word exclamations where split digraphs and polysyllabic words, that are difficult to decode, are used.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Explain who is correct when identifying the one-word exclamations. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 2 and 3 phonetic decoding is required.

Expected Explain who is correct when identifying the one-word exclamations. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 4 and 5 phonetic decoding is required.

Greater Depth Explain who is correct when identifying the one-word exclamations. Includes one-word exclamations where split digraphs and polysyllabic words, that are difficult to decode, are used.
