Greater Depth Circle the exclamations that could be used as a warning. Includes oneword exclamations where split digraphs and polysyllabic words, that are difficult to decode, are used.

Developing Add an! to words that can be an exclamation. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 2 and 3 phonetic decoding is required.

Expected Add an ! to words that can be an exclamation. Includes one-word exclamations where Phase 4 and 5 phonetic decoding is required.

Greater Depth Add an ! to words that can be an exclamation. Includes one-word exclamations where split digraphs and polysyllabic words, that are difficult to decode, are used.






