Differentiation:

Greater Depth Rearranging words and punctuation to create a question when using words made up of all taught sounds as well as words taken from the Year 1 spelling lists.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Application)

Developing Create an answer to a question when using vocabulary that is phonetically decodable but does not feature spilt diagraphs.

Expected Create an answer to a question when using vocabulary that is phonetically decodable using knowledge of all taught sounds needed for the phonics screening.

Greater Depth Create an answer to a question when using words made up of all taught sounds as well as words taken from the Year 1 spelling lists.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain if a sentence is a question when using vocabulary that is phonetically decodable but does not feature spilt diagraphs.

Expected Explain if a sentence is a question when using vocabulary that is phonetically decodable using knowledge of all taught sounds needed for the phonics screening.

Greater Depth Explain if a sentence is a question words made up of all taught sounds as well as words taken from the Year 1 spelling lists.


