Greater Depth Choose three nouns to complete the two-clause sentence using the coniunction 'and'. Nouns used are in full sentences where sentences contain words which cannot be easily decoded.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain the error when labelling a picture with a noun. Most words featured are easily decodable without split digraphs.

Expected Explain the error when labelling a picture with a noun. Words featured are decodable with knowledge of all phonetic sounds required for the Year 1 phonics screening.

Greater Depth Explain the error when writing a sentence (including a noun) about a picture. Nouns used are in full sentences where sentences contain words which cannot be easily decoded.

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
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
