Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Label compound nouns. Includes simple compound nouns where the words have a similar meaning, for example: football, snowman.

Expected Label compound nouns. Includes compound nouns where the two nouns are joined but the meaning is not the same, for example: strawberry, greenhouse.

Greater Depth Label compound nouns. Includes less common compound nouns where the nouns are joined but the meaning is not the same, for example: rainbow, scarecrow.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Underline compound nouns within a sentence. Includes simple compound nouns where the words have a similar meaning, for example: football, snowman.

Expected Underline compound nouns within a sentence. Includes compound nouns where the two nouns are joined but the meaning is not the same, for example: strawberry, greenhouse.

Greater Depth Underline compound nouns within a sentence. Includes less common compound nouns where the nouns are joined but the meaning is not the same, for example: rainbow, scarecrow.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Explain whether listed words are all compound nouns. Includes simple compound nouns where the words have a similar meaning, for example: football, snowman.






Developing

1. A. pancakes; B. teapot; C. blackberry
2. A. snowman, snowballs; B. sunglasses, seashells; C. football, newspaper.
3. Josh is incorrect. 'Netball' and 'handstand' are compound nouns. However, 'shouted' cannot be split into two separate words.

Expected

4. A. hotdog; B. cupcake; C. popcorn
5. A. sunflower, greenhouse; B. birthday, strawberries, raspberries; C. minibeast, ladybirds, earthworms.
6. Talia is incorrect. 'Butterfly' and 'earwig' are compound nouns. However, 'centipede' cannot be split into two separate words.

Greater Depth

7. A. cheesecake; B. doughnut; C. milkshake
8. A. suitcase, passport, suntan; B. floorboards, cobwebs, cupboard; C. scarecrow, sweetcorn
9. Solomon is incorrect. 'Rainbow' and 'rainforest' are compound nouns. However, Solomon has misspelt 'reindeer'. This is not a compound word.
