## Step 1: Relative Pronouns

### National Curriculum Objectives:

### Differentiation:

**Developing** Questions to support the recognition and application of relative pronouns. Using who or which with relative clauses are at the end of the sentence.

**Expected** Questions to support the recognition and application of relative pronouns. Using who, which, when, where, whose or that. Some of the relative clauses are embedded in the sentence.

**Greater Depth** Questions to support the recognition and application of relative pronouns. Using any relative pronoun, including: whom, whomever, whoever, whichever or whatever. Most relative clauses are embedded and some of the sentences include multiple pronouns.
