



3. A. friend – concrete, bunch – collective, flowers – concrete; B. brother – concrete, France – proper; C. excitement – abstract, rollercoaster – concrete; D. breakfast – concrete, Jason – proper, flock – collective

4. Various answers, for example:

The <u>herd</u> of elephants stomped noisily across the <u>plain</u>.

James was well-known for his <u>talent</u> in football.

5. Marcel is incorrect because he has used the collective noun 'flock' to describe a group of lions. The correct collective noun for a group of lions is 'pride'.

6. Sentence B uses the abstract noun 'discussion' correctly. Sentence A uses 'happy' instead of 'happiness', and sentence C includes a concrete and a collective noun but does not include an abstract noun.
