Developing

1. Ben = he; Ben's = his
2. Helen is incorrect. 'They' refers to mum and dad however, 'we' refers to mum and dad as well as the two children.
3. Various answers, for example:

It was a beautiful summer's day and the children, who were all nursery age, were playing nicely together on the grass. Joshua loved playing with building bricks so he decided to build a tower. Eleanor always wanted to play with the ball so she had asked Leo to play too. They were simply kicking the ball back and forwards to each other.

The rope ladder which he had attached to the top platform, had been found in the garage under a pile of waste bags. He believed in keeping things just in case they might be needed, much to the dismay of his family. The garage was like a junkyard.
