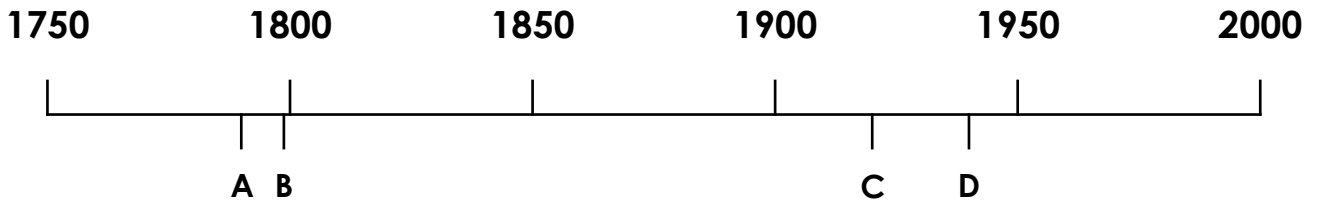

The gap between the rich and poor had grown so big that some people felt their only choice was to make a stand against the king, Louis XVI. This eventually led to the monarchy being overthrown and a new government leading the country instead.
